Visual art scholastic event

SHS students competed in the regional Visual Art Scholastic Event (VASE) on March 5, 2011 at Mansfield Timberview HS and did an outstanding job.

38 students had a total of 72 pieces judged with 52 medaling and advancing to the Area round. Even better, eleven had perfect scores!

Around the state more than 24,000 art pieces are judged in VASE each year with only 1200

advancing to the state exhibit in Houston.

Sophomore, Faith Ann Hardcastle's "Pieces of Me" was selected for this prestigious honor. At the state contest, Faith Ann received her second perfect score of the year and was awarded a state medal.
